Purpose and Need Statement: Vergennes PEL Study

The *purpose* is to reduce the impacts of through truck traffic, including safety, congestion, noise, vibration, and dust on Route 22A in downtown Vergennes. Transportation solutions that reduce truck related quality of life impacts should also meet the mobility, safety, and economic vitality needs of Vergennes and the neighboring communities. A summary of the *needs* identified are detailed below.



Mobility and Access: Maintain opportunities for the movement of freight in the region and minimize and/or mitigate traffic impacts to other transportation corridors



Safety, Circulation and Resilience: Support the continued movement, resilience and safety of travel through downtown Vergennes and in the neighboring communities.



Quality of Life: Improve the quality of life and minimize negative property and environmental resource impacts in downtown Vergennes and neighboring communities.



Land Use: Support local and regional land use plans and policies and state land use goals.



Economic Vitality: Promote economic vitality of downtown Vergennes, goods movement in Vergennes and neighboring communities, and support rural economy.

Draft List of Alternatives and Screening Criteria

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Draft "Long" List of Alternatives and Screening Criteria: Purpose

The purpose of establishing a long list of alternatives is to:

- Consider an exhaustive list of alternatives that may address the Purpose and Need of the Study
- Obtain input from the public on all alternatives being considered *prior* to screening

The purpose of establishing draft screening criteria is to:

- Propose questions under the Purpose and Need Statement that will assist in filtering the long list of alternatives
- Obtain input from the public on the criteria being considered *prior* to screening

The long list of alternatives should contain all potential solutions to address the *Purpose* of the Study, while the screening criteria is how effectively they address the *Needs* identified.

Draft List of Alternatives: VT 22A Corridor Alternatives



- Continue to permit trucks on VT Route 22A
- Proposes further enhancing recent VT Route 22A improvements such as:
 - Reconstruction and widening of Route 22A outside Vergennes to accommodate truck traffic
 - Traffic calming and multi-modal improvements on Route 22A through downtown Vergennes
- Includes a "No-Build" Alternative which includes:

Draft List of Alternatives: Existing Road Alternatives



- Includes utilizing a network of existing roads to encourage or require trucks to use other state highways for freight traffic.
 - VT Routes 17, 30, and 125
 - US Routes 4, 7 and 9
 - Interstates I-87 and I-89
- May include:
 - Physical improvements to existing roadways to accommodate truck traffic
 - Restricting and/or prohibiting trucks on Rte. 22A though legislation and increased enforcement
 - Truck wayfinding/routing



Draft List of Alternatives: New Road Alternatives

- 50 5
- Includes all New Road Alternatives considered under previous studies (1995, 2002, 2019)
- New Road Alternatives consider diverting trucks away from downtown Vergennes as a potential solution to reduce their impacts
- New Road Alternatives are conceptual ideas and - exact locations are to be determined



Draft List of Alternatives: Other Freight Modes



- Includes transitioning truck freight cargo to rail and water transportation modes
- Includes considerations for "Smart Freight" alternatives such as electric vehicles (EVs) and Connected and Autonomous vehicles (CAVs)







Draft Screening Criteria: Needs

- Upon establishing the long list of alternatives, each alternative will be subject to "screening" based on the Study's needs.
- Each need has a set of criteria which will be used to screen the alternatives being considered.
- The "screening" process will assess the effectiveness of each alternative to meet the Purpose of the Study.



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Draft Screening Criteria

Quality of Life and Environment

Reduces truck noise and emissions
Avoids known environmental resources
Maintains/supports community character

Equity

Balances distribution of transportation resources

Avoids burdens to historically disadvantaged and environmental justice populations

Mobility and Access

Maintains freight mobility throughout the region
Creates opportunities for multimodal travel throughout the region
Promotes greater destination access to downtown Vergennes to for all modes

Economic Vitality



Promotes economic vitality in downtown VergennesPromotes regional economic vitality

Safety, Circulation and Resilience



- Creates redundancies to improve resilience of road network
- Improves motorized circulation throughout the region
- Improves non-motorized circulation throughout the region
- □Improves motorized and non-motorized safety on Route 22A through downtown Vergennes

Land Use



 Consistent with existing regional land uses
Aligns with future and projected regional land uses and statewide goals

Draft Screening Criteria: Applying to Alternatives

Alternatives that do not satisfy the Purpose and Need, or have less than a "Net Positive" will be screened out from further evaluation

Public Workshop Recap

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Public Workshops (May and June, 2022)

- Three (3) Public Workshops were held in May and June
 - Advertised through: PEL Study email, Vergennes Open Forum, direct mailers, door hangers and on social media
 - May 24, 2022: In-person public workshop at the Otter Creek Park (Open-house format)
 - May 26, 2022: In-person public workshop at the Vergennes Opera House
 - June 1, 2022: Virtual public workshop
- Workshop Overview
 - Facilitators gave a brief overview of the four alternative types
 - Participants were encouraged to provide feedback through discussion and interaction with the boards (or through the chatbox online)
 - Each facilitator provided highlights of the feedback "themes" at the end of the workshop to all participants for further discussion



General Participant Feedback:

- Appreciated the opportunity to see a variety of options and give input
- Concern with how potential new road alternatives would impact Otter Creek Park
- Mixed opinions about whether truck traffic in downtown Vergennes is a problem
- Highlighted the importance of coordinating and planning with neighboring towns
- General support for grouping alternatives or elements of alternatives together
- Cost needs to be considered when evaluating alternatives

May 24, 2022

Public input focused on the four alternative types considered in the Study:



Vergennes PEL Study Public Workshop, May 2022

- Concern with impacts to Otter Creek residents
- General support for new roads with minimal impact to Otter Creek
- Concern with cost effectiveness
- Concern with impacts to tourism / boating and new bridge height

New Road Alternatives

Existing Road Alternatives

- General support for systemwide alternatives
- General support for VT 17/US 7 alternative

• Concern with current geometry and elements of existing roads to accommodate trucks Overall positive reaction to existing VT 22A projects
Concerns with steep grade at Otter Creek and other downtown Vergennes design elements
Overall positive reaction to VT 17 NB / VT 22A SB alternative

> VT 22A Alternatives



- General support for considering rail and water alternatives as a supplement to others
- Concern in loss of trucking industry jobs for smart freight options
- Concern that technology is not advancing fast enough

Vergennes Opera House Workshop

May 26, 2022

Public input focused on the four alternative types considered in the Study:



Vergennes PEL Study Public Workshop, May 2022

- Concern with cost effectiveness
- Concern with pushing the issue to neighboring towns
- Concern with impacting tourism and boating
- Discussion on a route closer to downtown Vergennes

New Road Alternatives

Existing Road Alternatives

- Some concern with pushing the issue to neighboring towns
- Concern with design deficiencies of existing roadways
- Mix of support and concern for prohibiting through trucks from downtown Vergennes
- Engage long haul trucking industry

• Noise from truck brakes on 22A

- Mixed opinions on recent traffic calming efforts
- Concern with speeding, safety issues and need for police enforcement on VT 17
- Interest in a pilot for the VT 17 NB / 22 A SB alternative

VT 22A Alternatives



- Interest in rail and water modes for less time sensitive freight
- Discussion on improvements that would need to be made for economic viability
- Interest in EVs though downtown Vergennes for noise/pollution benefits

Virtual Public Workshop

June 1, 2022

Public input focused on the four alternative types considered in the study, listed below



• Discussion on benefits to a new crossing over Otter Creek

• Discussion on preference to existing network to any new roads

New Road Alternatives

Existing Road Alternatives

• Mix of support and concern for using existing network of roads due to road deficiencies

• Discussion on US 4 to US 7 as a more cost-effective option

• Discussion on need to upgrade intersection with VT 17 / US 7 intersection • Discussion on safety issues/speeding on VT 22A

- Concern with continued VT 22A improvements encouraging more traffic
- Difficult for trucks to navigate existing VT 17 due to road deficiencies

VT 22A Alternatives

Other Freight Modes

- Positive reaction to using rail and water as a supplement to other alternatives
- Discussion on needed enhancement to transload facilities
- Seasonal limitations to NY water canal operations
