The Vergennes PEL Study is a three-year, in-depth study to evaluate transportation alternatives that could reduce the impact of large truck traffic on Vermont's Route 22A as it passes through Vergennes. The Study will consider the economic vitality, environment, and quality of life in the northern Addison County communities of Vergennes, Ferrisburgh, Panton, Waltham, Addison, New Haven, and Weybridge.











